## SENIOR CITIZEN PROPERTY TAX RELIEF IN BERKSHIRE COUNTY

#### I. SENIOR "CIRCUIT BREAKER":

•If you are 65 or over before January 1, 2016, you may be eligible to claim a refundable Senior "Circuit Breaker" tax credit against your Massachusetts personal income taxes for the rent or real estate taxes you paid on your principal residence. The maximum credit allowed this year is \$1,070. (For more information, go to:

## II. PROPERTY TAX WORK-OFF ABATEMENT:

•Taxpayers over 60 may be eligible for a Senior Citizen Property Tax Work-Off Abatement. Under this program, taxpayers volunteer their services to their municipality in exchange for a reduction in their property tax bills — up to \$1,000 annually.
